## The Bell

Do we understand why we ring the bell before church service every Sunday? The history of the bell goes back many years and has been used for many reasons and occasions. The earliest record of the bell in the Bible is when God gave the commandment that a small bell had
 to be sewn onto the hem of the robe worn by the high priest, which he had to wear when he entered into the temple to offer sacrifices for the Jewish people. This was so that the people, when they heard the sound of the bells ringing, knew that God was going to dispense His Blessings.

When we were young and attended school for the first time, we may remember hearing the bell to let us know that school was to begin where we were taught many new things. Ringing the bell was thought to be a privilege, as it was looked upon as a very important duty.

The same applies at our church. It is normally the duty of the janitors to ring the bell ten minutes before service starts, to alert the members that we are being called to enter into the church in readiness. This gives us the opportunity to sit and think about all the good things that God has done for us during the past week and maybe the things we shouldn't have done.


Just before service begins, the bell rings again to indicate that God is about to dispense His Blessings, just as it was when the high priest entered into the temple so many years ago. It is during this time that all the members, including the children, can be in unity in singing hymns of praise to God, praying in thanksgiving to our loving God, listening to the preaching of the Gospel message, and asking God for all those blessings that are necessary so that we can live our lives as God's children.
