
A-maze-ing Bible Journeys of Jesus



Did you know that the word Lent is not found in the King James Bible? The word Lent came from an old English word, 'laencte' meaning, lengthening (of daylight hours).




We as Christians have the opportunity to pray, meditate and understand the importance of Good Friday and Easter.




